Tips for tourists in Granada

Lunch and dinner times are quite late, usually at around 2pm and 9pm or later. Most restaurants won't serve food before 1pm and 8pm.

Many shops will be closed during the hotter hours (2pm to 5pm) - Siesta time!

Temperatures in May vary from 20 to 35°C (68 to 95°F) - Stay hydrated and use sunscreen protection!

In Granada, you will be served a free tapa with every drink! In some places, you can choose which one (usually with a limit of varieties per table), but in other places the staff will decide what to serve - In case of food restrictions, let them know beforehand!

Granada is a very safe city and Spain is among the safest countries in Europe and the World. However, beware of possible tourist scams in the streets. Do not under any circumstance accept "gifts" from strangers (e.g., rosemary leaves), they will ask you for money after that.

Tips for tourists in Granada

You can buy a reusable card (only for buses) and share it to validate for several travellers. You can buy it from machines at some bus stops, at tobacco shops (aka 'estancos') or ask for it directly to the bus driver (say 'Tarjeta monedero' and then the amount of money you want to deposit - 5, 10 or 20 euros). Single tickets cost € 1.40, while travelling with a card costs only € 0.44.

If you use the metro system, you'll need to buy your card before entering and then validate it inside of the wagon.

Most people will be able to understand and speak English for basic communication, but try to be patient and use easy vocabulary to be better understood. People will also appreciate if you learn some greetings in Spanish! (Try 'hola' for hello, 'por favor' for please and 'gracias' for thank you - they will love it!).

Tap water is very good quality and you can find public fountains throughout the city - check that there's no sign stating 'No potable', i.e. non-drinkable. Also, in restaurants you can ask for free tap water (they're legally required to serve it if asked), but their default option will be bottled, so be clear with this by asking for 'agua de grifo' so you don't get charged.

- Bus: 3€, 1h ride. Timetable at viajeronomada.com/ir-del-aeropuerto-de-granada-al-centro/.
- Taxi: 30-35€, 20min ride.

Madrid-Barcelona airports

- You will need to get to the city centre and then catch a bus or train. Check www.omio.es to find the best connection.
